
































#### NPA YOUNG ACHIEVERS RECOGNISED

OUR FEATURE THIS WEEK-NPA JUDO CLUB

The NPA Judo Club was originally established in August 2012, delivering a school holiday program for students with the assistance of NPARC in the September break.

9 children were introduced to judo during that program, as well as 4 adults. In term 4 of that year classes commenced for adults and children and they were delivered twice a week. In December 2012, 4 adults were graded to yellow belt and 6 children to their first belt.

Over the next two terms of 2013, the club grew steadily, normally having 12-15 children and 6-12 adults during those sessions. We had begun to draw players from Bamaga and Seisia.

Mid-year (2013) the NPA Judo Club was invited to compete at the Cairns Regional Championships. A team of 24 competitors was selected and after significant fundraising and coordinating activity, the club made the 1000km road trip down to Yorkeys Knob to put our skills to the test. By any measure, we excelled, collecting 18 medals, including 3 new regional champions, 3 runners up and 12 bronze medalists. What a fantastic result!

Following this success, the club partnered with the NPA State College to begin delivering judo as part of the Active After School Care program. Since that time the NPA Judo Club has been enjoying 25-30 kids on the mat at any one time. Adult classes have remained constant at about 10-15 participants a night.

The results to date have been an amazing.

Jack Zieth travelled to Adelaide in September to compete in the Special Needs Friendship Games. He came third in his division and also received the Referee's award, presented for his representation of the judo spirit.

The NPA Judo Club also participated in World Judo Day in 2013, celebrating the International Judo Federation's theme of 'Perseverance' by putting on its own competition here. The club received a grant from the Torres Strait Youth and Recreational Sporting Association to purchase mats. 36 children and 12 adults participated. The NPA Judo Club is an inclusive sports club that is, it encourages participation over and above winning and tries to nurture a lifelong involvement in the sport of judo, instilling the principles of Kodokan Judo and the discipline that is normally associated with the Japanese martial arts.

A brief synopsis of the club, based on the students who have participated this year alone, reveals the following:

> 17 U12 girls, 19 U12 boys 1 U15 girl, 4 U15 boys 2 senior women, 16 senior men 4 men 30 yrs plus, 3 men 40 yrs plus, 2 men 50 yrs plus and one 70-year old man. 45 students who have identified as either Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islanders, 2 students who have identified as Special Needs athletes.

The club has attracted some attention from the clubs down south. From June 11-17<sup>th</sup>, the NPA Judo Club will be visited by Senseis John Brendecke (2<sup>nd</sup> Dan) and Andreas Schmidt (1<sup>st</sup> Dan) of Coral Coast Judo Club, National Open Champion and Australian Team Member Sebastian Temesi, National Heavyweight Champion George Brendecke (2<sup>nd</sup> Dan), Northern Beaches Judo Club Sensei Karl Michaelis (4<sup>th</sup> Dan), National Under 12 Champion Toby Sagacio and his father, Senpai Jeff Sagacio. This group has been sent by the Judo Federation of Australia to run a coaching development seminar and Active After School Care program for the coaches and senior students we have here. The day before the seminar, we will be hosting the NPA Open Tournament, inviting the other clubs of North Queensland to compete against us.

The club's next major event is the Australian Judo Union's National Championships in Cairns in June, 2014. It is planning to take a large contingent from the NPA and expect to be competitive.


Each student at the Injinoo Campus received Silicon Wrist bands that say
