
Deadly Ears Outreach 26-29th March

The Queens Baton Relay

NPARC and partnering organisations will welcome the Queens Baton Relay on Sunday 4th March 2018. There will be multiple events happening in all five communities which is being organised by the Councillors, NPARC events team, local community groups, tradition owners and our local schools. NPARC congratulates the Baton Bearers who will be partaking in this prestigious event.

Injinoo

The Queens Baton will arrive at 9:04am by charter boat at the Injinoo Lookout. Organisers of the event encourage all community members to muster at Injinoo Lookout to welcome the Queens Baton into the NPA Region. Mayor Eddie Newman will conduct the formal proceedings, followed by cultural performances and a free BBQ breakfast. The Queens Baton will then make its way to Umagico.

Umagico

The Queens Baton will arrive in Umagico at 9.40am and will be welcomed with traditional dancing from the Wabuna Geth Umagico Group. Residents and community groups are encouraged to muster at the Umagico Hall by 8.30am.

Bamaga

Local children of the NPA State College and Junior Campuses will line the streets as a 'guard of honour' for the Queens Baton arrival into Bamaga. The Berlibal Dance Team will then perform at Yusia Ginau Oval which will also have children's activities and a free BBQ brunch. Baton Bearers will begin Relays at 11.17am and their will be a final performance by the Naygayiw Gigi Dance Troupe at Nona Creek.

New Mapoon

Residents of the New Mapoon community are encouraged to cluster outside the NPARC Office to welcome the Queens Baton by 11:30am.

Seisia

Seisia will be the last community and closing of the Queens Baton Relay. NPARC and event organisers encourage as many families to gather at Seisia Wharf to farewell the Queens Baton as it travels towards the Gold Coast. There will be a free community BBQ lunch and cultural performances.

Baton Bearers

Remembrance of the Torres Strait Infantry Battalion with John Adidi

"Let us give thanks to the brave 800 soldiers who put their lives at risk and made significant sacrifices to shield for their beloved ones." John Adidi.



It is the 75th Anniversary of the Torres Strait Light Infantry Battalion held on Thursday Island. This commemoration event will be held on the 17th March 2018.

This is a day of celebration and remembrance for the 800 brave men who formed this Battalion whilst Singapore and Japan fought during World War II. (1945)

The first soldier to join this army was Private Solomon Gela from Darnley Island. Soldiers were from the Torres Strait Islands and the Northern Aboriginal communities.

Soldiers from the Western Islands of Saibai, Dauan and Boigu were selected to defend the Japanese at Mereukee,

Western Papua New Guinea. These soldiers were strategically placed given their local knowledge and expertise in mangroves, rivers and swamp warfare. The Torres Strait Light Infantry veterans were the only Indigenous contingent, Which were made up of men who later received Australian Star Medals in the early 1980s. They were acknowledged for volunteering there lives in protection of their communities.

The Torres Strait Light Infantry Battalion is currently displayed in remembrance through announcements, song and dance in the Torres Strait Islands

Descendants of these veterans have been invited to participate in the celebrations on Thursday Island.

- Flip over boats and slides etc.


Keep boats and associated fishing tackle undercover

Local Fare Scheme

Local Fare Scheme - Airfare subsidy for regional and remote Queensland

The Local Fare Scheme is an airfare subsidy that aims to improve the standard of living of local residents in regional and remote Queensland communities by making air travel to neighbouring communities more affordable.

The airfare subsidy is available to local residents who have lived in their eligible community for 3 or more years, Residents may receive a discount of up to \$400 for return airfare bookings when travelling between the following airports:

- Cape York: Aurukun, Coen, Kowanyama, Lockhart River, Northern Peninsula, Pormpuraaw and Weipa. Map of local air routes (PDF, 144 KB) (https://www.tmr.qid.gov.au/-/media/Travelandtransport/Maps-and-guides/capeyork.pdf?la=en)
- Gulf of Carpentaria: Doomadgee and Mornington Island. Map of local air routes (PDF, 128 KB) (https://www.tmr.qld.gov.au/-/media/Travelandtransport/Maps-and-guides/morningtonisland.pdf?la=en) Torres Strait: Hom (Ngurupai), Badu, Talbot (Boigu), Coconut (Poruma), Darnley (Erub), Mabuiag, Kubin, Murray (Mer), Saibai, Sue (Warraber), Yam (Iama) and Yorke (Masig) Islands. To be eligible for the scheme, local residents will be required to provide a letter from their local council to prove they have been a resident in Cape York, Gulf of Carpentaria or Torres Strait community for a minimum of 3 years.

Conditions

- Up to \$400 discount for return travel, including GST; up to \$200 discount is applied to each one way fare, including GST. Minimum fare payable is \$99 each way, including GST, plus booking fees.
- Residents must book return travel, one way flights not eligible.
- Residents must apply for a Letter of Eligibility through their local council before booking discounted fares under the Local Fare Scheme. .
- . Discounted airfares under the scheme are only available through a local ticketing agent.
- Discount applies at the airline's discretion. .
- Discount cannot be applied to entry level airfares or tactical sale fares. .
- Fare rules are in accordance with the fare type booked, set by airlines.
- Discount is for personal air travel only, not for employer paid or government use.
- Not to be used in conjunction with any other government travel subsidy.
- Use is limited to 12 times per financial year, per person. .
- Only for use on scheduled air services to selected communities in Cape York, Gulf of Carpentaria and the Torres Strait. .
- Not for use on charter services.
- · Transport and Main Roads can change any aspect of the scheme at any time, including but not limited to discount amount, community scope, seat availability and eligibility requirements.

Steps for booking your flight

Step 1 – Apply for your Letter of Eligibility

Visit your local council and demonstrate (your local council will set requirements) that you have lived locally for a minimum of 3 years. If approved, your council will issue you a Letter of Eligibility. Contact your local council for more information.

If you have lost your Letter of Eligibility contact your local council for a replacement.

Step 2 – Buy your ticket

Visit your local ticketing agent to buy your ticket.

Bookings can be made on behalf of family members if each family member has a Letter of Eligibility.

To access discounted flights through the Local Fare Scheme you must:

- present photo ID
- present photo ID provide your Letter of Eligibility book a return flight from an eligible airport through the local ticketing agent complete travel by 30 June 2019. Please note: Eligible residents of Doomadgee, Mornington Island and Weipa Town Authority, may book flights any time, but travel will need to be complete by 31 August 2018 as access to this scheme is currently a trial. advise the ticketing agent the reason for travel

Depending on the type of fare you have booked you will need to contact your ticketing agent if you miss your flight or need to change it.

If you miss more than 2 flights within a 12 month period you may not be able to receive any further discounted flights
