- Animals will only be taken if they are sick and in need of care and/or have been abandoned.
- Owners have asked staff to take unwanted animals.

Additional benefits of Permanent De-sexing:


- Reduced risk of getting cancer or other diseases.



First 5 Forever Tips

What if you Picinini no like Books

Wanem e happen when you prapa wandah readeh storybook por you picinini but m always seems to gat all other ideas and no teke notice for wane you try por do? E pretty common, some picinini e like story time more than others and settle down prapa quick and relax lo quiet time blow thempla but sometimes lo all other picinini e papa hard. But nor looseh heart cos you can still addeh literacy building activities into youmpla everyday life even wherere youmpla small bundle of energy.

Trye some of them ideas ya lor thempla where you lor house: When you batheh you picinini or play lo thempla lo car or toys, e prapa good time for sing all song lo thempla and all nursery rhymes. This one e activity you mekem where e no gat book involved and when you sing for thempla everytime e help thempla por buildem up love for all words and sounds. All go mina love it and this one go back for thempla early literacy. Point out all words when youpla go anywhere cos all words e everywhere. Readeh the packaging lo kaikai time and also teke notice for them street signs and yarn for thempla about the words you look inside lo shop. No give up lo books, sometimes a few tweaks and changes go meke real difference. Maybe you can swapeh story time lo different parent, maybe you can ask aka or athe too for yarn story lo thempla from them book. Meke you picinini choose books and allow thempla por flick through and look for them picture together.





You no need for read e story word for word or from start to end for gedeh thempla for larn. Keepeh all books where easy spot for you picinini can easy grabem and leteh thempla explore anyway thempla like. Always encourage book sharing but nor force thempla. When you share reading, e should be a positive experience for you and your picinini. Borrow all books from your local IKC as part blo you routine and loan them out, e for free as long as you sign up and become member. This one go helpeh thempla transition between all activities. E no have to be a long story time but more like you starteh yarn, Eg. book bout transport or book bout toys for playtime. Yarn about the differences and similarities between all books and wanem happen lo you house. Grabe some prapa objects to help makeh the story time playful. Addeh scarf to play peek-a-boo when youpla shareh story where youpla picinini or characters e hide or include stuffed toy that can be your feature in the story for you picinini por holdem or make sounds of blo onem action you makem. Kasa shareh little bit pages or shareh story lo you daily activity, like you bath time. You go be surprised that you picinini go love to be a part blo the story. Youpla must visit youpla IKC regularly for 'First Five Forever' session or you picinini go be more interested for walkabout inside the room and m go be exploring than singing and listening and that one e alright because all still larn. E important too when youpla take part in them activities too, and all go look all nother picinini too, e go reinforce the same idea that books e fun. Starteh routine lo bedtime where you yarn story or nursery rhyme or song for thempla. When you yarn story try remember wanem story you been readem when you been small picinini or makeh one story up when you bin picinini n b gat interest lo. Remember whadth, that a lot e happen lo early childhood journey blo youpla picinini and I encourage all pamleh for must habeh the time to engage lo youpla picinini lo all sorts of experiences and must keep trying.
