# 75th Anniversary Torres Strait Light Infantry Battalion

NPARC and My Pathways proudly hosted a Charter Ferry with Peddells Torres Magic organisation. The Torres Magic Ferry chartered 86 passengers to Thursday Island (T.I) from the NPA to Celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the 800 Indigenous men that formed the only Indigenous Battalion for the Australian Army in World War Two 1943.

Commemorations started with an official March through the main Road of T.I to Anzac Park. Once arriving at Anzac Park Prayers, 'Welcome to Country', historic stories, announcements and entertainment were done for residents and visitors to T.I.

Mr. Awati Mau and Mr. Mebai Warasum ex - servicemen for the TSLIB were invited to 'Turn the Sod' as this is a traditional ceremony in many cultures that celebrates the first day of construction for a project/statue.

Once the formalities had concluded the community proceeded to lay wreath in front of the TSLIB monument plaque as a reminder that their sacrifices will not be forgotten and a reminder of their love for their country.

Close to 3000 New Zealand soldiers died during the eight-month Gallipoli campaign.

When war broke out in 1914 Australia had been a federated Nation for only 13 years, and its government was eager to establish a reputation among the nations of the world.

When Britain declared war in August 1914 Australia was automatically placed on the side of the Commonwealth. In 1915 Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of the expedition that set out to capture the Gallipoli Peninsula in order to open the Dardanelles to the allied Navies. The ultimate objective was to capture Constantinople (now Istanbul), the capital of the Ottoman Empire, an ally of Germany.







### State Emergency Services Update

Tropical Cyclone (TC) Nora and ex TC Iris have threatened communities within the Western Cape areas which caused strong winds, flash flooding and road closures in the Port Douglas, Cairns and Mareeba areas.

Personnel were flown into Weipa, Kowanyama, Pormpuraaw and Aurukun ahead of TC Nora warnings. To assist with managing Cyclone Shelters, provide Cyclone Advice, After Impact Emergency Communications, Rapid Damage Assessments and Clean up assistants.

For the first time, battery operated equipment were used to assist clean up operations in both Pormpuraaw and Kowanyama. The equipment proved to be the most ideal way to transport through Queensland Government Air (QGAir) rather than the traditional petrol operated equipment. The battery operated chain and pole saws handled the workload with ease.

As the night approached the rain started pouring, two cars were found caught in the floods. There were 42 people rescued by Swift Water Rescue and the State Emergency Service (SES) teams in the Western Cape areas. The 42 people were rescued and transferred to be cared for by the Cairns SES team in the Cairns Local Head Quarters (LHQ). Cairns SES provided food and showers for the evacuees while Cairns Council arranged emergency accommodation in nearby Motels.

Acknowledgement to NPARC's Executive Manager of Corporate Services - Edward Sailor, who has recently been appointed to the Executive Volunteer position of SES Local Controller. Edward attended the SES Executive Conference within the SES Headquarters Saturday & Sunday (24th and 25th March).

Appreciation messages were sent to the Rescue teams as the evacuees were relieved and astonished with the hard work that the volunteers had put in. Below is a simple text from a pair of travellers on holiday that experienced flooding and evacuation processes while staying at the Crystal Cascade Big 4 Holiday Park.



"We wish to express our enormous admiration and gratitude to all involved in our rescue/evacuation from the Big4 Crystal Cascades Holiday Park at Redlynch earlier this week. It was a very traumatic event for us all. Many of the other evacuees were overseas visitors with limited English. All have expressed their admiration for the dedication and professionalism of all agencies involved in this rescue/transition/relocation and recovery process. Would you please ensure this email is passed on to all team members involved in this event. The people of Cairns have shown us incredible warmth, help and support throughout this ordeal. Cairns is regular holiday destination for us and will continue to be so". - Sally and Derek Whitehead

# Basic Pre-Cyclone Checklist

#### When a cyclone watch is issued

+ Re-check your property for any loose material and tie down (or fill with water) all large, relatively light items such as boats and rubbish bins.

Fill vehicles' fuel tanks. Check your emergency kit and fill water containers.

+ Ensure household members know which the strongest part of the house and what to do in the event of a cyclone warning or an evacuation.

+ Tune to your local radio/TV for further information and warnings.

Check that neighbours are aware of the situation and are preparing.

#### When a cyclone warning is issued

+ Depending on official advice provided by your local authorities as the event evolves; the following actions may be warranted.

+ If requested by local authorities, collect children from school or childcare centre and go home.

+ Park vehicles under solid shelter (hand brake on and in gear).

+ Put wooden or plastic outdoor furniture in your pool or inside with other loose items.

+ Close shutters or board-up or heavily tape all windows. Draw curtains and lock doors.

✤ Pack an evacuation kit of warm clothes, essential medications, baby formula, nappies, valuables, important papers, photos and mementos in waterproof bags to be taken with your emergency kit. Large/heavy valuables could be protected in a strong cupboard.

Remain indoors (with your pets). Stay tuned to your local radio/TV for further information".
